Despot Stefan Lazarevic (1402-1427)

First ruler of the Serbian Despotate (Moravian Serbia, northern, central and eastern parts of the former Serbian Empire including Zeta from 1421-1443)







Nobleman Djuradj Brankovic (Lord of Kosovo 1402-1412) and Lazar Brankovic (Lord of Kosovo 1406-1410)
